Antigone is an old story. Older than the United States, older than Germany, older than Greece, older than the Ottoman empire. Written originally in 441 BC, some children in our company figured out that Julius Caesar could have seen this play. This classic story, the first to be performed of Sophocles' plays, has a simple plot. A girl goes out to bury her brother, in defiance of the king's order. The king happens to be the girl's uncle. The girl happens to be engaged to his son. The brother has been declared a traitor. The girl does what must be done.

In 1942, Nazi Germany has occupied France. The occupation government decrees that no new work can be performed, only classical work. The French Resistance is organizing. Jean Anouilh translates Sophocles' *Antigone* into French and adapts it to the modern era. In 1944, inspired by the French Resistance, *Antigone* is staged. In 1947, translated by Lewis Galantiere, *Antigone* plays in New York City.

Now in 2023, a virulent strain of anti-intellectualism is flourishing. This ideology has spread legislatively to include half the country, with laws that prevent students from learning about race, history, sex or gender identity. These laws prevent students from engaging with important modern texts as well as classical ones. Some students are not allowed to study Shakespeare in school, while others are allowed only excerpts. All of us at Children's Shakespeare Theatre find great meaning in having children explore classical theatre through performance, which includes discussion of race, history, sex, gender and other important concepts.

Throughout its history, Children's Shakespeare Theatre has remained committed to nurturing the confidence and creativity of young people in our community. Each actor has an opportunity to wrestle with what it means to be human through the enriching process of putting on classical plays. CST is dedicated to creating a superb artistic and educational experience, enriching the lives of its young actors, their families, and the surrounding community.

This is Children's Shakespeare Theatre's twenty-fourth season, The Season of Questioning Authority. We are pleased to present this powerful piece. Thank you for joining us!




We provide a local, intimate setting for live theatre - a place to share the stories that connect our lives.

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

In 1999, Diana Green revived Children's Shakespeare Theatre and transformed CST into the thriving theater program that it is today. During her tenure Diana directed an impressive sixty-six productions, producing many others, and cementing CST's reputation as a premier children's theatre company.

In 2021, Diana Green retired from her position as Artistic Director and Brady Amoonclark became Artistic Director. Under Brady's leadership, CST has continued to flourish.
